Minibus	£6000	Contribution towards the minibus to transport pupils to and from sporting fixtures, tournaments and training sessions
Further Transport	£300	<p>Cross Country and the County Games We had 32 pupils attend the cross country finals and transport was needed to Lewsey Park. We had three top 10 finishes and lots more pupils were given the opportunity to run this year from William Austin.</p> <p>Three teams qualified for the Summer Games County Finals which meant that 36 pupils were involved in a level 3 competition in cheerleading, cricket and curling. There were 8 teams from Bedfordshire taking part in each of the events and the William Austin Cheerleading team finished in 2nd place overall winning silver medals and the Curling team in 3rd place winning bronze medals.</p>
Cheerleading Coach	£837.50	Cheerleading has been a great success at William Austin and a new sport that has been introduced. Mrs Hutchings worked with the cheerleading coach at lunchtimes so any pupils could attend the club regardless of how big the group was. This allowed Year 4, 5 and 6 pupils to have a lunchtime club with over 100 pupils taking part. 25 pupils were then chosen to work with Mrs Hutchings and the cheerleading coach at lunch times and an additional session with Mrs Hutchings after school to

		<p>train for the Luton Town Cheerleading competition. WE decided to add in the Gymnastics boys that work with Mrs Hutchings at Advanced gym club to the do the stunts and tumbling part of the cheerleading routine. This proved to be a great idea as William Austin won the Luton Town Cheerleading competition even though they had never entered before. They then went onto County finals and finished in 2nd place. We were also able to include over 75 pupils from cheerleading club of all abilities in the Annual Gymnastics and Dance display that performed in 3 cheerleading routines. This club has greatly improved the confidence and self-esteem of many of the pupils in particular the pupils that prefer aesthetic activities to games activities</p>
Gymnastics Coach	£487.50	<p>Elliott Brown an international gymnast worked with Mrs Hutchings at a morning strength and flexibility session and at an afterschool club with some of the gifted and talented gymnastics boys some of which were pupil premium or more challenging in a classroom environment and thrive from practical subjects. Elliott proved to be an excellent role model that the boys looked up to. This also allowed Mrs Hutchings to take larger groups so that the group could be split in half when necessary so each had either Mrs Hutchings or Elliott working with them.</p> <p>Gymnastics had gone from strength to strength at William Austin with the Year 3 and 4 gymnasts winning both the Luton Town Gymnastics Competition and the County Games Competition. The Year 5 and 6 gymnasts won the regional competition and 4 gymnasts went onto National Finals to compete against the top 13 schools in Great Britain with William Austin finishing in 6th and 8th place. Also over half of the routines (nine) were</p>

		gymnastics in the Annual Gymnastics and Dance Display that involved over 180 pupils of different abilities in 5 days of displays and 1000 spectators.
Active Luton Staff Inset Dance Teacher Netball coach Hockey coach	£1092	<p>Active Luton have provided inset for staff at William Austin Junior School in tennis, netball and fitness this year. This has helped the games staff to develop their confidence and subject knowledge in these sporting activities and as a result deliver higher quality Games lessons with more of a focus on active play.</p> <p>The netball and hockey coaches allowed an additional 40 pupils to take part in sports clubs whilst the PE teachers were running different clubs.</p> <p>The dance teacher worked with Mrs Hutchings one lunch time a week so that larger groups could be taught. The club was so successful that over 100 pupils took part during the 2 terms that dance club was on for Year 3, 4, 5 and 6. We were also able to invite 90 pupils to take part in the Gymnastics and Dance display of mixed ability in 3 routines. In addition to this Mrs Hutchings street dance boys in Year 4 finished 2nd in the Luton Town Street Dance competition and were invited to perform at Denbigh High Schools gymnastics and dance display as well as the one at William Austin. This club has allowed more pupils to take part in a club and has developed their self-esteem, confidence and has helped them to lead a healthy lifestyle. The gym and dance display was also a major highlight of their year as they wore costumes and performed with professional lighting with the family and friends there to support them</p>
Athletics Stickers	£115.31	This was a great success and something to continue next year. Booklets were designed for athletics lessons so that pupils could record their scores and they would

		<p>then receive a William Austin designed gold, silver or bronze sticker if they achieved a certain time or distance. By the end of the term pupil's booklet were full of shiny stickers if they achieved bronze, silver or gold or a white sticker if they achieved level 1 or 2. The great thing about this new national award scheme for primary schools is that nearly everyone receives at least a level 1 sticker so it gives pupils a feeling of success.</p> <p>They also had the opportunity to try and beat their original score during the athletics lessons after setting themselves a target.</p> <p>Pupils then took their colourful booklets home to keep. Again a great confidence boost and something to talk about with their family</p>
Medals	£126.42	<p>Medals were ordered for sports day this year for all of the pupils that finished in 1st place. This is the first year we have done this and it was a great success. Medals were rewarded for all races including the very competitive throwing and sprinting and events such as the sack race and egg and spoon.</p>
Equipment	£1304.36	<p>We were able to buy a new hockey bag this year with smaller hockey sticks meaning that the Year 3 pupils could use the correct hockey sticks instead of the plastic sticks allowing them to make better progress.</p> <p>One of the most successful areas money was spent was on the new GROUP SYSTEM that was introduced into PE lessons and then games lessons. Money was used to purchase 25 sets of bibs for Year 4, 5 and 6. All 30 pupils were then allocated a group colour. The green and orange group are the most able pupils and the red, blue and yellow group mixed ability. Each group has a sports leader and pupils work together as a team each lesson trying to score points</p>

		<p>for their team. The team with the most points at the end of the lesson receive a house point and a point towards a rewards day at the end of term.</p> <p>The PE department have seen greater progress in lessons since the group system has been introduced. The green and orange group are challenged at their level and the other three mixed ability teams have greater confidence and have more contact with the ball in the games activities. It also improves leadership skills as in Year 4 all pupils have an opportunity to be a sports leader and in Year 5 and 6 five members of each class are sports leaders (one for each group). This was implemented into the staff games lessons as it greatly helps with organisation and differentiation as well as the sports leaders assisting the member of staff with equipment and organisation.</p>
