To understand the effects of ultraviolet light

Planning

Does the strength of sun protection cream affect the colour of the beads?

Predictions

The higher the SPF the lighter the beads. The lower the SPF the darker the beads.

Variables

We will change the strength of the SPF every time we do the test.

What we will keep the same?

The type of beads. The same way to measure (15 minutes). The position on the playground.

What we will observe?

The colour of the beads and record it using the colour guide.

Method

- Choose a spot on the playground.
- Place the beads on a paper towel.
- Put sunscreen on the beads depending on what you're going to do.
- Stand the timer for 15 minutes.
- Observe the colour change and use the chart to record the results.

Conclusion


I have discovered that the higher the SPF the lighter the beads that means that wearing a sunscreen protects us from the harmful UV rays that the production makes. The experiment tells us that wearing sunscreen will make the sunburn going on our skin less than when we don't wear any sunscreen.
