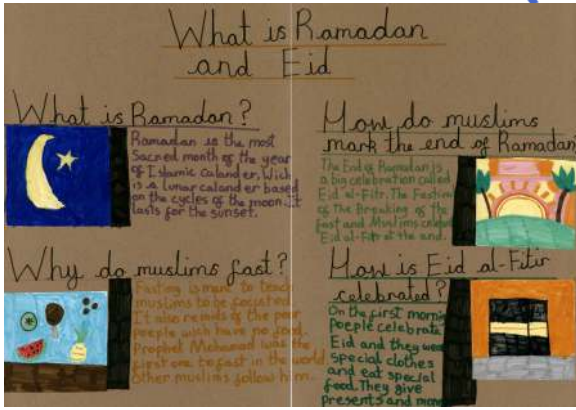
**Vaccinations** - If you are over 50 and/ or clinically vulnerable and live in Luton you can walk in at the following sites to be vaccinated without an appointment.

- Mobile Bus, Sainsbury's carpark, 34 Dunstable Road LU1 1DY 10am - 5pm Friday, Saturday, Sunday

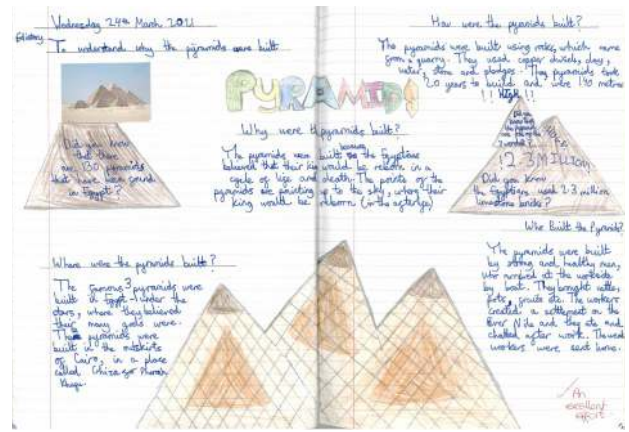
Numbers are increasing again so please encourage your family and our community to get vaccinated.

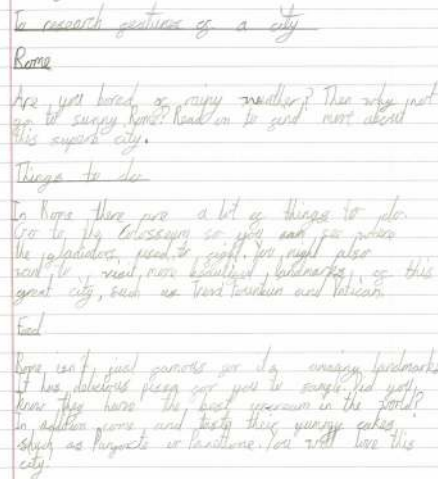
