





### Art - Mrs Zerva

Lots of exciting learning has been happening this term in Art. In Year 3, they are currently creating pieces of Art work that are linked to Romans. In Year 4, classes have enjoyed a unit of work with Pop Art creations. In Year 5, they are exploring the repeated patterns and they have studied various artists of that style. In Year 6, they are looking at creating textiles practising their stitching skills being inspired by Van Gogh's artwork.

It has been a fantastic week in Year 3. We went on a fantastic trip to Verulamium to find out about life in the Roman times. The children were excited to see what was left of the city after it was destroyed by Boudicca and were amazed by all the artefacts in the museum. In English, we have been learning how to write a fable. The children have explored the features and created fantastic characters who have opposite character traits. In Maths, we have continued to explore measuring in different units, learning how to convert measurements to compare and calculate.
