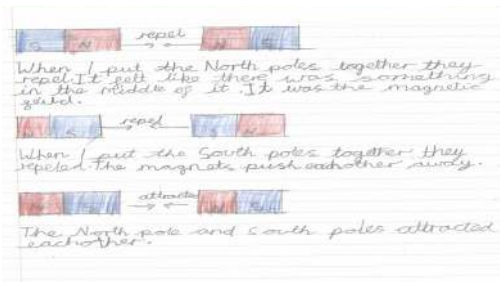

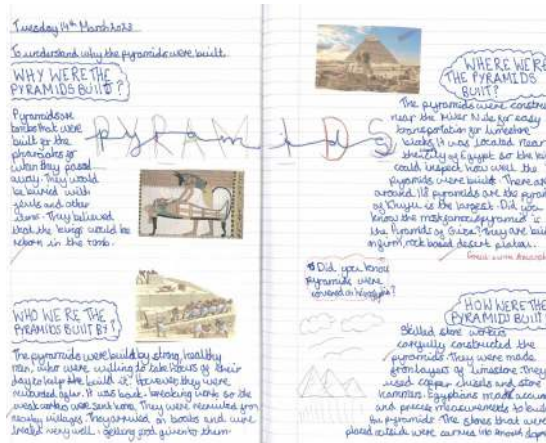

William Austin Junior School Care Inspire Achieve

Are you searching for a wonderful junior school for your child? Well, it looks like you bumped into the right school! William Austin Junior School is a terrific, hardworking school located in north west Luton, close to Wardown Park. This school accepts all nationalities aged from 7-11 years old. So, how is our school more unique from any other school?

William Austin's Vision

Everyone at William Austin believes that all children should get a wealth of experiences. Teachers have developed a fun and also challenging curriculum to ensure that all children can earn their time to shine and achieve more. Caring is a part of our school motto and is in the heart of everyday.

School Day

Generally, the school day begins at 8:48am. Every morning starts with an hour of maths and English. Once a week, our students will use their reading skills with guided reading. Everyday, pupils will get the opportunity to relax during their 15 minute break or 1 hour lunch break. This lets our pupils visit our state-of-the-art library and choose from the abundance of some of the highest quality books.

Our Uniform

Students are encouraged to dress neatly and take part in representing their school. Normally, the pupils wear a uniform which consists of a white button up shirt, smart trousers, gold and royal blue tie, and a blue jumper or cardigan with the school logo emblazoned on the left. As well as this, girls may choose the option to wear a grey skirt or a pinafore with black tights. While it's warm, the children can choose to wear a polo shirt instead of the signature white shirt and tie.

Computing at our school

William Austin Junior School owns a widely-known computing department. Every single student participates in a wide selection of lessons using the newest pieces of technology such as coding, spreadsheets, online safety and even BUILDING ROBOTS. This school has a high-quality IT suite with more than 30 computers which are used daily every lunchtime for clubs. Recently, the school has purchased over 100 chromebooks! This means that our students get the opportunity to use a mix of devices in a variety of lessons including times table practise and reading quizzes.

Geography — Mrs Bano

The Geography curriculum at William Austin Junior school inspires children's curiosity about the world and its people which will remain with them for the rest of their lives. Children are encouraged to develop a broader, deeper understanding and knowledge of the world as well as their place within it. Geography at William Austin junior school promotes interest and understanding of diverse places, people, resources and natural and human environments, together with a deep understanding of the Earth's key physical and human processes. This enables children to develop knowledge and skills that are transferable to other curriculum areas, which are used to promote their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. This term in year 3, children are learning about Italy, the location of this country and comparing its physical and human features with a place in UK. In year 4 children are learning about Spain. Pupils will be locating Spain on a map, locating capital cities and its regions. Children will also explore the diverse culture of Spain. In year 5, children are looking further afield in North America, in particular, they are learning about Alaska, its physical and human characteristics and making comparisons with Scotland. Finally in year 6, children will research what a settlement is and examine it in more detail. At the end of each term, children showcase their learning by creating a report including all facts they have learnt about their country.

Year 3

We have had a very busy week in Year 3. In English we have started a new unit looking at non-chronological reports. When they arrived at school on Monday, the children were shocked to see that Year 3 was in a complete mess. There were things knocked over and glitter hoof prints everywhere. After checking the CCTV cameras, we discovered that a storm unicorn was to blame. The children are now busy finding out about storm unicorns and other animals ready to write their own non-chronological reports. In Maths, we have started looking at measuring mass and the children have made a good start with learning how to read scales. In Science, the children are enjoying learning about how magnets work.

Year 4 have enjoyed a great start to the term. In English we have started a new unit looking at journey stories. The children created some beautiful firework art to go along with the Firework Maker's Daughter story that they are basing their English on. In Maths, we have started to look at fractions and so far, children have enjoyed representing mixed numbers and improper fractions. Swimming has resumed and children have loved this as an addition back into the timetable. As always, please keep supporting children with reading and learning their times tables at home.

In maths, children are now able to calculate the area of triangles and the volume of cuboids! We are excited to be moving on to learning about statistics where we will construct line graphs and pie charts, and calculate the mean. We have continued to classify in science and are observing, over time, the effect of microorganisms on bread. Our embroideries are well under way and children are enjoying showing off the range of stitches they have learnt. Thank you for your continued support.

Parents' Evening
