It has been an exciting week in Year 3. On Thursday, we took part in our Science Day, carrying out lots of experiments with different materials. The children really enjoyed working out which was the best material to keep the gingerbread man dry and which thread would be best for James to tie seagulls to his giant peach with. We also made lava lamps to help the owl who was afraid of the dark and got very sticky discovering the properties of Oobleck. In Maths, we have continued to look at measuring mass and capacity, reading scales and working out intervals. In English, the children have been writing non-chronological reports about dogs and we are looking forward to reading their own report about an imaginary animal later this week.

Year 6

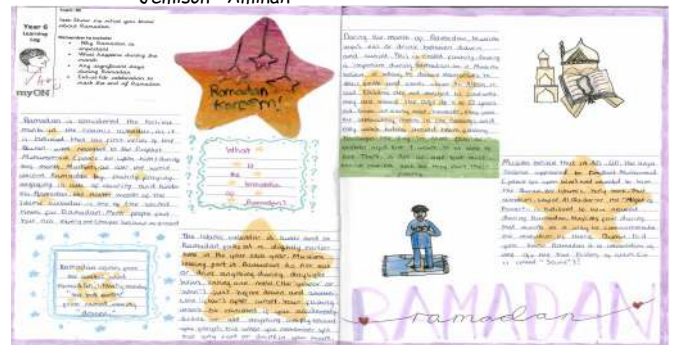
