Please join us for a fun session of cookery and to meet new people every Friday mornings from 9:00am -11:30am. These sessions are free.



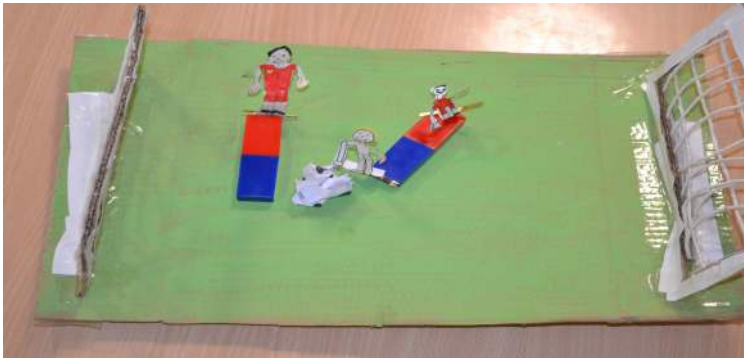

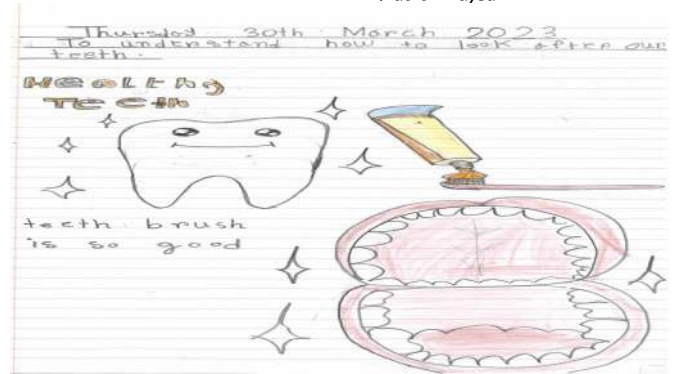

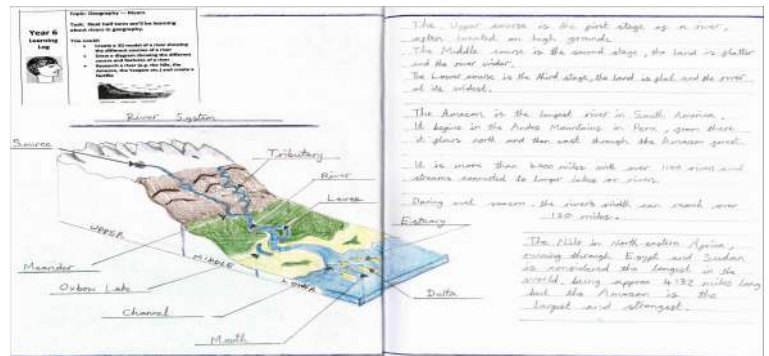

Year 6

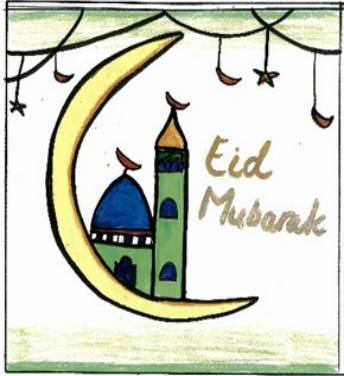
