Dear Family

We have arranged a trip to Hazard Alley Safety Centre in Milton Keynes. The visit enables children to learn essential safety skills in the interactive Education Village and they will take part in nine safety scenarios

The trip has been arranged for the classes as follows: -

Wednesday 14th February Hokusai and Hepworth Thursday 15th February Hadid and Van Gogh

Friday 16th February Baker

On the day children should wear their school uniform and ensure they have a coat. A packed lunch and drink will be required. We will be leaving school at 9.00 am prompt and returning by 3.30pm. Children should ensure they are at registration at 8.40 am that day.

The cost of this trip is £23.25 which comprises an entrance charge at Hazard Alley of £14.25 plus transport. Please note that in the event of your child's absence, we will not be able to refund the entrance charge as this has been prepaid. They will however send the resources that your child would have received on the day.

Payment should be made on line at SCOPAY. Please ensure you have their app. Please contact the school office if you require a link code.

For children in receipt of free school meals, the cost of this visit will be met from Pupil Premium and the school will provide a packed lunch. However, you will still need to complete the permissions section on the app for your child to take part.

As this trip is more expensive than others, it is possible to make a combination of payments on SCOPAY so you are not paying all at once. You are able to customise the amount paid. Please ensure the total amount is paid by Friday 2nd February. The visit cannot go ahead if sufficient contributions are not received.

STATEMENT TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS ON INSURANCE COVER

- Where a pupil is injured or their personal property damaged by an accident caused by the Local 1 Authority, its employees or any voluntary helper, a legal claim for damages can be made against the Local Authority. The Local Authority has insurance cover to meet such proven claims.
- 2 If the accident was not caused by the Local Authority, its employees or voluntary helpers, then you cannot be compensated by the Local Authority. You may however be able to make a claim on a third party such as a motorist if involved in the accident.
- 3 If your child is going on a school trip or outing, then the above advice is the same, but this school has also arranged additional insurance to cover for accidents, loss of possessions and medical expenses. Full details are available from the school office.
